



Dear Parents, Friends and Guardians

Ash Wednesday – Next week – 10 February

The church's season of Lent commences next week with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. This day signals the start of the journey towards Easter and the celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus. Our church sees this time as one of preparation for the Easter season and one in which we are invited to reflect on how we go as Christians. In reflecting we are asked to focus on our relationships with each other and our relationship with our God. We can't have a good relationship with our God if we don't have a good relationship with each other and we can't have a good relationship with our each other if we don't have a good relationship with God. They are mutually dependent. During Lent we are challenged to look at how we treat others and how we treat ourselves – if we don't strive for inner peace for ourselves then how can we have it with others. Jesus would say that this inner peace can be found through loving one another, all the time and unconditionally. This is a pretty tough assignment for me as I'm sure it may be for many of us but we're not alone in the struggle. As a Christian community of Marymount schools and the Burleigh Heads parish we have like-minded colleagues to walk the journey of reflection with us – we just have to be open to each other and be respectful and conscious of each other – from young to old. We are blessed to have so many young children here with us – they have no agendas – they are just life in all its glory – maybe we can learn from them and their freshness. It is certainly one of the things which keeps me coming to school every day. Good luck with your Lenten challenge and for your relationships with each other.

Parent Teacher Information Meetings – Monday, 15 February

On the above evening our teachers will conduct their annual Parent Information meeting. At these meetings our teachers will share information about the main teaching themes in the curriculum areas as well as discuss matters like parental help, classroom management and behaviour systems, incursions and excursions, camps, homework policies and so on. The meetings usually go for just on 45 minutes and there will always be the opportunity for general questions. Communication avenues for parents and the class teachers will also be shared and as such it is important that parents endeavour to get along for these meetings. If you can't make it our teachers will often be able to send home some handout booklets or sheets with general information on them though these are not as good as actually being there to hear first-hand what's happening. It would be best if children were left at home as there will be no teacher supervision available during the meetings. I look forward to seeing as many parents there as possible so that we can keep our communication channels as open as possible.

Car Park News

Thanks to our parents and families for their patience and, in some cases their extreme patience, as we work through the mechanisms of our new car park and set down drop off facilities and their associated vagaries. It has been pleasing to see so many parents adapting quickly to the new procedures. We, our Leadership teams from both schools, have endeavoured to be present as much as possible in the various parts of the new and old systems so that we can get the whole picture of how it is working. We have shared in many discussions with various stakeholders over the last week or so and this has really helped us as well. We are very aware that the new system will have some teething issues – it is a very significant change to what we have previously had. It has been designed to work in tandem with any new entry / exit points from Sunlight Drive. The full closure of this area of our school and parish site has meant though, that we have had to make some alterations to our original design. This was unforeseen but we hope to have this extra area open for use by next week. It will give us an extended north / south internal road up past our current teardrop roundabout. There will be space up in this area for the set down and pick up of secondary students which will free the main new area for primary parents. More information on this will be forthcoming as it opens up.

We will be meeting with our traffic engineer and other consultants who have put the project together to feed back our initial learnings and then look to make the necessary changes in time. Please know though that these will only be minor adjustments and signage issues. Our main aim is to ensure that the new internal north / south access road becomes the preferred method of set down and pick up. Other areas like the old public car park area will not be great for quick access in and out especially during our peak afternoon period as cars trying to exit from here cause stoppages to the main access road. Cars parking in here will be blocked in for much longer times than what used to be the case. The external bus lane has been tapered so that buses only can exit from this lane. New signage should go up over the next few days and into next week so I would ask that you please keep an eye out for these and adhere to their directions.

The new bitumen car park area is designated for staff parking only. Please respect this, as even though there may appear to be vacant spaces, both schools do have staff who start later in the day or who may be attending meetings before coming to school.

We will continue to have the edge of our primary oval open for temporary parking at the start and end of the day for the families of our Prep and Year 1 children. Eventually though we will need to reclaim this space for play areas for the children and we would ask these families to discuss the option of drop offs and pick-ups in the new designated area. We will arrange for our Prep and Year One classes to visit this area and we will even have a demonstration of what's involved as part of the education process for this new system. I realise that some children might not yet be ready to handle this idea and that is why the area in the Public car park will become a place for long term parking to help the children adjust.

With the merge of traffic from those parents parked on our oval back into the main stream of traffic at the tear-drop I would ask that cars merge in time so as to allow for both streams to move. This is a simple courtesy gesture and it helps out all parties involved.

Please also encourage your children to utilise the pedestrian crossings in the car park and at our entry. Sadly some of our parents are not setting the right example here and this is encouraging dangerous habits in the children. I know that this may take extra time but it is in the best interest for your children and it is demonstrating to them the importance you are putting on their safety. The safety of our children has been at the heart of all we are trying to do with this new area. If it means that you have to adjust your timelines in the morning or afternoon then I would argue that their safety is worth the change. I would ask that our parents please pass this information on to any grandparents or other family members who do the drop off or pick up. Often the new system can cause confusion for them as they don't know or understand the focuses of it as they haven't seen any information on what to do. We have many extended family members who visit our school and your help in passing this information on would be beneficial for all.

Thank you again for your patience as we re-educate ourselves with the changes, it is greatly appreciated.



Dear Parents/Caregivers

We write to enlist your support. This year we have over twenty children at Marymount Primary School who suffer from Anaphylactic shock which is a life threatening situation.

Some foods that may cause anaphylaxis for some children at Marymount are:

* Dairy * Nuts * Peanuts * Fish * Egg

We hope you appreciate that direct contact with any of these foods, even on the handrails and bubblers after eating 'trigger' foods, can be life threatening for some of our children.

In order to provide some assistance in preparing your child's lunchboxes we ask that you consider the suggestions listed below. Please note that some suggestions relate to the entire school community whilst others relate only to children from Prep to Year 2.

Regarding food brought from home, we ask you to consider (all children Prep to Year Seven):


- Avoiding **dairy** products that are prone to spillage (for example, yoghurt, custard and milk)
- Avoiding **dairy** products that are particularly sticky (for example, spreadable cheese, chocolate coated products and ice-cream)
- Avoiding any **fish**
- Avoiding **peanut and nut** products (including peanut butter, chocolate nut spreads and muesli bars containing peanuts, nuts and sesame seeds).
- Avoiding products that have **Sesame seeds** (for example, Sesame Snaps and bread and rolls with seeds).
- Avoiding **eggs**

Please note:

- Although a lot of products contain dairy, the items listed above (yoghurt, custard, milk and particularly sticky dairy items) are considered to be the most dangerous.
- Block cheese and cheese slices are considered acceptable food.
- You may like to use **Nuttalex** Spread (which is dairy and nut free) as an alternative to butter.
- Often manufacturers have precautionary warnings on the products that state "may contain traces of nuts /and or milk". These products are safe to be consumed at school as long as peanuts or nuts are not the ingredients in the products.

As a Marymount community we cannot guarantee a risk free environment. Each child with Anaphylaxis has an individual Action Plan in case of an anaphylactic reaction. We do however ask for your continued support in helping minimize the risks of food related problems for some of our children.
