### Dear Parents, Friends and Guardians

### Staff Professional Development

Last week I wrote about some of the things which our staff are involved in so that we keep up to date with the latest developments in areas like the treatment of health issues for children, learning trends and strategies for the children as well as Religious Education and spirituality needs for our staff and children. Members of our staff have been involved with many quality professional development opportunities in these and other areas within the last few weeks alone. One area of focus for our school and staff for this year is in the area of Behaviour Management. Our school is introducing a program which a number of our Brisbane Catholic Education schools have adopted in the last three years. The program is called Positive Behaviours for Learning or PB4L. It involves a whole of school approach to the behaviours of our children with the obvious focus on the positive behaviours which our children exhibit every day. A group of our staff have already been involved in training for this program during Term One and they have begun to develop a framework for what type of behaviours we expect here at Marymount. This has already been shared with our teaching staff through our Staff Meetings and further work will be ongoing throughout this term. Members of our Leadership Team and some of our Specialist teachers will be undertaking more external training in Brisbane next week. Tina O'Keefe (Assistant Principal) and I will join with Sylvia Kelvin (Learning Enhancement) and Mary Sanders (Guidance Counsellor) for a two day session along with a number of other school groups who are at a similar stage in their program. This training will look at how to work with children and families who may exhibit behaviours which are contrary to our school values and expectations.

The whole program is based on the latest research and development in this area and it brings into play many features which are common in today's society and schools but may not have been ten or twenty years ago. The child of today is vastly different to the child of the last decade and as such our behaviour management processes need to acknowledge this and work with it. This is one of the main things with PB4L and thus the need for reframing our methods and strategies. We will present more on the PB4L program in future newsletters as well as at our P & F meetings so please keep an eye out for these updates.

#### Parent Portal and Semester One Reports

Our Parent Portal was introduced earlier this year and it's been great to hear of the number of parents who have taken up this new method of communication between home and school. If you have already been on to the Portal you would have had to provide your Username and then been given a password so continuing contact with the Portal shouldn't be a problem for you. For those parents who haven't yet logged on there are instructions later in this newsletter on how to do so. Our Semester One Report Cards will be presented online this year and we will cease the process of providing hard copies of the children's reports so it is imperative that you log into the portal. There are a number of other things on the Portal which are aimed to make communication better for all parties and I would strongly encourage all parents to sign up to our Parent Portal. If you have problems with this medium please contact our Parent Reception and we will endeavour to rectify the issue. ### PARENT PORTAL


### **Marymount Primary**

Have you logged into the Parent Portal yet?

Here you can access Newsletters, log your child's absence from school, update details, view class blogs.

This year, the Parent Portal will be the only way to access your child's Semester Report. These will be placed online ready for access in Week 11 this Term.

Reports will not be printed and sent home from school.



The initial login requires you to verify your identity and setup a password. This document will run you through the process.

Go to the Marymount Primary school site, and click on Community access OR click on the direct link below

https://extranet.bne.catholic.edu.au/parent/marymountprimary

Start the process by clicking on the link above. You will be met with a login screen.

- Select Brisbane Catholic Education and select Forgotten Password/First-Time Login.
- Select the link under the Parents heading titled choose your own password online.
- Enter the personal email address that you have provided to the school (this is the email address from the enrolment form, or is used by school/teachers to contact you) and click Next.
- 4. Check your email for a security code and enter the corresponding security code in the screen that follows and click Next.
- 5. Ensure that Password Reset option is selected and enter your desired password in both boxes before clicking Next.
- 6. Now that you have set your password you can now login to the Parent Portal by following this link https://extranet.bne.catholic.edu.au/parent/marymountprimary


### Marymount Mob Message Stick

This is a worthwhile opportunity for your family to learn about Japanese culture, while sharing with your Japanese student the lifestyle of an Australian family.



- Families are asked to provide all meals and a friendly home for their student
- They will travel to and from school each day the same way as arranged for your own children (please provide transportation fee)
- Payment of \$400 to host families will be paid to assist with some of the expenses involved when hosting your student
- If you are hosting another Japanese student during Yuhigaoka High School's stay, please refrain from becoming a host family for Yuhigaoka High School students.

## Yes, I would like to host a Japanese student, but...



### Will the student speak any English?

Yes. However, as their English skills may be limited, we would ask that you speak clearly and slowly (but not in a patronising way) when communicating with them.

### Will I have to cook Japanese food for the student?

No. Your Japanese student is here to experience an Australian lifestyle. This includes spending mealtimes with your family, and eating what you and your family normally eat.

### Is it OK if the parent/s work fulltime?

Yes. During these times (e.g. after school), your Japanese student can spend time with your own children. Families who live near each other are encouraged to share transport, or other activities outside of school.

#### Do we need Blue Cards?

Yes. If your family hosts an overseas student for 10 or more days, it is necessary for all family members over the age of 18 to have a current Blue Card. Please contact the school office to obtain blue card application form.
